



2005-06 Grant Awards

Total Grants Awarded: 26
Total Amount Awarded: \$1,103,111

- **Almira Township: \$20,000**

Capital: To provide improved access to the Ransom Lake Natural Area, located in the Platte River Watershed between Lake Ann and Long Lake.

- **Benzie County: \$20,000**

Capital: To construct a barrier free access and viewing platform at the Point Betsie Historic Lighthouse. (Challenge Grant)

- **Beulah Public Library: \$40,000**

Capital: To help build a 3,000 square foot library with a new public meeting room to meet the demand for expanding collections, programs, computers, etc. (Challenge Grant)

- **Blair Township: \$30,000**

Capital: To provide a poured-in-place rubber surfacing for under the two main play structures to allow handicap children and adults access around the Blair Township Hall playground area.

- **Catholic Human Services: \$15,000**

Pro-Active/Program: To support Host Homes for Homeless Youth, which matches identified youth with host families to provide safe, temporary housing, keeping high risk students from dropping out of high school.

- **City Opera House Heritage Association: \$50,000**

Capital: To construct an elevator shaft and cab and make related renovations that guarantees full accessibility to the City Opera House by all populations. (Challenge Grant)

- **Community Resource Development: \$35,000**

Program: To provide funds for the recruitment and hiring of a full-time Director for Mancelona Vision 2020, an affordable housing project in cooperation with Antrim Habitat for Humanity.

- **Conservation Resource Alliance: \$30,000**

Program: To create an expansion plan that will guide the development of the WildLink program into identified watersheds or corridors within the Grand Traverse Region.

- **Good Samaritan Family Services: \$15,000**

Capital: To purchase a truck for picking up food for the Good Samaritan Pantry to help the growing number of needy client families in the Ellsworth area. (Challenge Grant)

- **Goodwill Inn: \$400,000**

Capital: To assist with the construction of the new Goodwill Inn to serve homeless families, adults and youth, located on Keystone Road.

• **Great Lakes Children's Museum: \$100,000**

Capital: To make improvements to the property on S. West Bayshore Road, so that it can be used as an Interpretive Center and the new location of the Great Lakes Children's Museum.

• **Kingsley Friends of the Library: \$40,000**

Capital: To support the construction of the new Kingsley Public Library Building. (Challenge Grant)

• **Leelanau Conservancy: \$1,800**

Capacity: To assist in developing a comprehensive Management Plan for the DeYoung Natural Area in Elmwood Township, including the development of key partnerships.

• **Long Lake Foundation: \$10,000**

Program: To develop a natural features inventory to preserve significant natural features within the community and the identification of likely trends or conditions that may threaten them.

• **Love, INC.: \$3,471**

Capacity: To update office systems from pencil/paper intake to computer technology.

• **Michigan Community Blood Center: \$35,000**

Capital: To assist in funding 60'x40' extension to the current facility at 2575 Aero Park Drive, which will house the area to consolidate mobile set-up operation including equipment, supplies to increase efficiencies and increase safety in the mobile set-up process.

• **Michigan Land Use Institute: \$20,000**

Program: To establish significant local food purchasing as a normal course of business to TCAPS in order to address two community needs - better dietary health for children and greater profitability for local farms.

• **Mills Community House Association: \$3,500**

Capacity: To hire a consultant to assist with assessment of needs, strategic planning and leadership development.

• **Mt. Holiday: \$45,000**

Capital: To refurbish and purchase snowmaking equipment. (Challenge Grant)

• **Northwest Michigan Council of Governments: \$50,000**

Pro-Active/Program: To support the Kal-Tec program, which will offer a wide variety of educational and skill development courses in Kalkaska County.

• **Northwestern Michigan Fair Association: \$35,000**

Capital: To fund the construction of a large, covered pavilion suitable for multiple uses, including large group gatherings, entertainment and livestock shows.

• **Preserve Historic Sleeping Bear: \$4,340**

Capacity: To fund the purchase of donor software and related services enabling expansion of Preserve Historic Sleeping Bear's donor and contact management and fundraising management.

• **Scenic Trails Council: \$5,000**

Capacity: To hire a consultant to assess development efforts, planning and staff needs.

• **Third Level Crisis Intervention Center: \$35,000**

To assist with the initial startup programming and staffing of the youth wing at the Goodwill Inn for the first year. (Challenge Grant)

• **TART Trails, Inc.: \$40,000**

Capital: To assist with continuing paving of the Leelanau Trail.

• **TC Area Chamber Foundation: \$20,000**

Program: To help implement the DevelopMentor Program. This grant completes Rotary Charities three-year commitment to implementation of New Designs for Growth Phase II.
